How to Outline a Debate

Hook: This should be something that draws the listener into your speech. Often times this is a quote, story, or statistic.

Thesis: [Something] [Does Something] because [Reason A, Reason B, and Reason C]

Claim A: This is the same as Reason A

Evidence: This is some bit of evidence that proves Claim A

Analysis: This explains why the evidence given is important

Claim B: This is the same as Reason B

Evidence: This is some bit of evidence that proves Claim B

Analysis: This explains why the evidence given is important

Claim C: This is the same as Reason C

Evidence: This is some bit of evidence that proves Claim C

Analysis: This explains why the evidence given is important

Conclusion: Here you will restate your thesis statement but in a different way. It should bring the argument to a logical conclusion and the audience should feel like there is nothing else to say.
